4. Admission to the Championship only at the request of national federations of sportsmen with special needs.

Hearing impairments

Deaf, Deaf Women, (Boys: Deaf-8, Deaf-10, Deaf-13, Deaf-16, Deaf-19); (Girls: Deaf-8, Deaf-10, Deaf-13, Deaf-16, Deaf-19)

Players with hearing impairment must have a hearing threshold in the better hearing ear of 55 decibels or more in accordance with the requirements of international sports organisations for deaf people, be fluent in deaf sign language and present/deliver hearing audiogram.

Visual impairments

Group 1 – totally blind players

Blind, Blind Women, (Boys: Blind U-8, Blind U-10, Blind U-13, Blind U-16, Blind U-19); (Girls: Blind U-8, Blind U-10, Blind U-13, Blind U-16, Blind U-19)

Group 2 – players with visual impairments

Visual impairment, Visual impairment Women, (Boys: Visual impairment U-8, Visual impairment U-10, Visual impairment U-13, Visual impairment U-16, Visual impairment U-19); (Girls - Visual impairment U-8, Visual impairment U-10, Visual impairment U-13, Visual impairment U-16, Visual impairment U-19).

Visual acuity – up to 6/60 and field of vision up to 20 degrees as ruled by the International Medical Commission. Each classification relates to the eye with the best vision and the best correction.

Damage to the musculoskeletal system

Mobility impairments, Mobility impairments Women, (Boys: mobility impairments impairment U-8, Mobility impairment U-10, Mobility impairment U-13, Mobility impairment U-16, Mobility impairment U-19); (Girls - Mobility impairment U-8, Mobility impairment U-10, Mobility impairment U-13, Mobility impairment U-16, Mobility impairment U-19).

Existence of disability in players with the musculoskeletal system damage – (severe, mild, or moderate damage of musculoskeletal system)

Cerebral palsy – severe, mild, or moderate.

Congenital or traumatic deformities of locomotor organs (arms, legs, fingers, spine; their shortening, any type of change leading to disability).

Disciplines

5. Swiss System, round or mixed

Number of rounds

Swiss System: 7-9 rounds (for 11 and more participants)

Additional criteria in case of equal number of points.

1. Personal meeting (for two participants only).
2. Trimmed Solkoff ratio (sum of opponents' points excluding the 1st worst, then sum of opponents' points excluding the 2nd worst, etc. until exhaustion)
3. Number of victories
4. In case of an equal number of points and all additional criteria met, an additional match

shall be played in two sets (for two players). In case of more than two participants, the additional tournament is played in one round of one game, taking into account the new additional criteria.

Each-all system: 7-10 rounds (for 3 -10 participants in 1- 3 rounds).

Additional criteria in case of an equal number of points.

1. Personal meeting (for two participants only).
2. The Sonneborn-Berger Ratio (the sum of twice the number of points of the defeated opponents and the number of points of the opponents with whom there was a draw)
3. Number of victories
4. If there is an equal number of points and all additional criteria are met, an additional match shall be played between two players from the two games. If there are more than two players, an extra game is played in one round from one game, taking into account the new additional criteria.

Mixed system: Swiss system consisting of 5-(7) rounds or "**each-all system**", followed by the Olympic system, consisting of semi-finals and finals (plus 2 additional rounds), in which whoever comes first after the 5-(7) rounds of the Swiss system will be deemed to have won the draw.

The draw for the players in the individual rounds is made using the Chess Arbiter Pro computer program.

TIME CONTROL:

-1 hour 20 minutes + 30 seconds per move for each player - Classical game (10 minutes before the end of the control - for the BLIND the time pressure zone applies; for the rest 5 minutes before the end of the control). Recording of the game in the time pressure zone is not necessary)

- 15 minutes + 10 seconds per move for each player - Quick game (RAPID)

- 15 minutes + 10 seconds per move for each player - Quick game (RAPID) - team game.

Factors for determining a place in case of equal number of points:

Team play - Quick (RAPID).

Swiss system.

1. Personal meeting (only for two teams)
2. Trimmed Solkoff ratio (the sum of the competing teams points excluding the 1st worst, then the sum of the opponent's team points excluding the 2 worst, etc. until exhaustion)
3. The number of team victories
4. According to the score on chessboard 1, in case of a draw - according to the score on chessboard 3 (women), in case of a draw - according to the score on chessboard 2 (only for two teams)
5. On the basis of the sum of all points scored by each player in the team.
6. In case of an equal number of points and all additional criteria met, an additional match shall be played between the two second teams from the same match and, in case of a draw taking into account the new additional criteria. If there are more than two teams, the additional tournament is played in one round from one match, taking into account the new additional criteria.

Round-robin

1. Personal meeting (for two teams only)
2. Sonneborn-Berger ratio (the sum of twice the number of points of the defeated opposing teams and the number of points of the opposing teams with whom a draw was recorded)
3. Number of team victories
4. According to the score on chessboard 1, in case of a draw - according to the score on chessboard 3 (women), in case of a draw - according to the score on chessboard 2 - (only for two teams)
5. On the basis of the sum of all points scored by each player in the team (from the team).
6. In case of an equal number of points and the fulfilment of all additional criteria, an additional match is then played between the two teams from the same match and in the case of a draw from the same team from the same match taking into account the new additional criteria. If there are more than two two teams, the additional tournament will be played in one round from one match, taking into account the new additional criteria.

Prizes

8. * Individual and team competitions:

Places I, II, III: diplomas, medals, cups.

Men, women as well as girls and boys (up to 8 years of age; up to 10 years of age; up to 13 years of age; up to 16 years of age; up to 19 years of age; (incl.) **are played separately in each category and age group.**

World Champion title in classic game;

World Champion title in quick game (RAPID);

* Team competitions:

Groups/teams consisting of: two men, one woman (a male reserve and a female reserve are possible)

Groups/teams consisting of: two boys, one girl (reserve boys, reserve girls possible) up to age 8; up to age 10; up to age 13; up to age 16; up to age 19 (inclusive)

Separately in each category and age group a game for the title of RAPID World Champion is played between the teams.

The World Checkers Championship - 100 between teams separately in each category and age group can be held with a minimum of 4 teams (not necessarily from 4 different countries). Each participating country may enter a maximum of two teams.

Rules regarding age categories and the possibility for female players to participate in the World Championships among men's players:

Both in the team and individual World Championships women may play on the men's chessboard.

Girls younger than 8 years; up to 10 years of age; up to 13 years of age; up to 16 years of age; up to 19 years of age (inclusive) may play on the women's or men's board, as well as in any of the older girls' age categories, and also on the youth board - but not in the junior age category to which they belong.

Boys younger than 8 years; 10 years of age; up to 13 years of age; up to 16 years of age; up to 19 years of age (inclusive) may play on the men's board and also in each age category of the senior boys.

Competitors in the visually impaired players' category may compete in both individual and team championships subject to the age category rules as described above and the possibility for women participants to take part in the World Championships among men.
